Construction begins on downtown Broken Arrow's streetscaping project

Broken Arrow city and community officials gathered inside the Main Street Tavern to reveal final plans for the streetscaping project and announce the location of Bruhouse Grill and Bar to The Rose District.

Hemphill Services was awarded the \$3.7 million contract to widen the sidewalks on Main Street between Dallas and College streets to increase usable space for local businesses, create a more pedestrian-friendly atmosphere, and become compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act.

The streets will be narrowed from four lanes to three lanes (two traffic lanes and a center turn lane) to accommodate the wider sidewalks while still providing ample space for parades and main street events. Other district enhancements and amenities will include planters and landscaping adopting the

and traffic signals, and an underground electrical system for special events.

Construction began June 10. All hardscaping is to be completed by Oct. 15 and all softscaping 30 days after. The goal is to return to business as usual before the holiday shopping season.

"It has been a long and delicate process to get us to this point, but it was important that we involve the community, merchants and downtown stakeholders every step of the way," said Councilor Jill Norman. "As a result, we feel we have put a plan together that best fits the needs and integrity of downtown Broken Arrow."

The construction plan follows a conscious approach to minimize impact on local businesses through several guidelines provided to the contractors.

The city has also awarded Roses Inc. a \$10,960 contract to provide landscaping services and plants to the newly constructed area.

"We have a tremendous opportunity to

transform our downtown area into an intimate gathering space for Broken Arrow residents and visitors," said Mayor Craig Thurmond.

Also Chamber of Commerce also announced a former Tulsa business, the Bruhouse Bar and Grill, will open in downtown Broken Arrow. Owner Travis Bruton has leased the former Angus Inn, at 201 S. Main St.

Finally, a website found at www.rosedistrict.com was launched for The Rose District.


