

2014 streets preservation projects begin

Thanks to a recently completed Street Index, the Streets and Stormwater Department is in a better position to prioritize street improvements.

“The Mayor and City Council approved the City Manager’s recommended 56 percent increase in street preservation funding this year, so Broken Arrow residents will really start to see street construction ramping up in their neighborhoods,” said City Manager Thom Moton.

As part of the initiative, several subdivision streets received face-lifts. Work began in the South Brook subdivision.

Crews removed the old asphalt layer in a process known as milling, then added a new layer of asphalt. The project cost approximately \$250,000. The City funded the project through the Sales Tax Capital Improvements (STCI) Fund, which cannot be used for general government operations.

Other neighborhoods and arterials soon to see street improvements are:

- Oak Crest Additions; Graham Franklin Park
- New Orleans Street from Olive Avenue to Garnett Road
- Vacation Center Subdivision

“Until we completed the Street Index, we didn’t know the total preservation we needed to renovate our streets,” said Steve Arant, Director of Streets and Stormwater. “Now we know, and we have identified where those repairs will occur based on available funding.”

Construction ongoing on tennis, basketball courts at Central Park

A City contractor began demolition of the Central Park tennis courts in May, to make way for a brand new recreational area.

Not only do the improvements include three (3) new tennis courts, but it will also add a new outdoor basketball court, new fencing, color system, nets and lighting.

The work is expected to be completed by Aug. 17. A Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) of \$370,000 is paying for the project.

“The new tennis courts will be rebuilt using post-tension slab construction, which will provide a great playing surface for users” said Scott Esmond, Director of the Recreation, Parks, Cultural Affairs & Tourism Department. “These improvements reflect the City of Broken Arrow’s commitment to providing the best recreational facilities for its citizens.”

BAPD warn against leaving vehicles unsecured

The Broken Arrow Police Department would like to remind citizens of the importance of locking vehicles and securing valuables, particularly during the overnight hours.

As the temperatures warm, and outside activity increases, there is a noticeable increase in the number of vehicles that are burglarized in the overnight hours. Unlocked cars and trucks are the prime targets.

The department has seen a notable increase in the number of burglaries to vehicles in recent weeks and has made several arrests related to these crimes as a result.

Typically, the offenders are teens and young adults who seek out the unsecured vehicles and take whatever they can find (loose change, cigarettes, phone chargers, GPS units, etc.). With more and more frequency,

items of more significant value are being left in vehicles and are being stolen as well. This list includes purses, wallets, laptop computers, tools, smart phones, and even firearms. These crimes are mostly crimes of opportunity and can be deterred simply by removing valuables from the vehicles and locking the doors.

To combat the problem the Broken Arrow Police Department will continue to augment traditional patrol with the use of police bicycles.

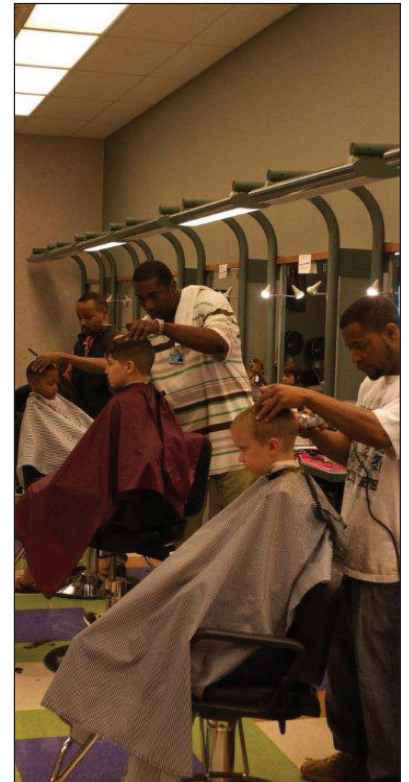
