

Michael,

We have a delivery for brick scheduled for Friday Morning. It will be similar to the partial closure we had when the city councilor drove by on New Year's Eve. I want to avoid any unnecessary complains and approach the material delivery properly this time. There is 10 pallets of brick that will be delivered. Should take less than 15 minutes to unload. We will have spotters directing traffic around the load. We will be able to keep 1 lane open and alternate traffic flow in that lane going both ways.

Please let me know if this is acceptable and I will confirm with my mason for the delivery.

The second closure we would like to setup is for Monday 1/19/15 first thing in the morning to setup a crane for our mechanical equipment going to the roof. We will have spotters directing traffic around the crane and will be able to keep 1 lane open and alternate traffic flow in that lane going both ways. We can be wrapped up by around 10:00 AM and open everything back up to normal.

If this is acceptable let me know and I will coordinate with the crane company.

Thanks for working with us on this and we are getting closer and closer by the day to complete construction.

Broken Arrow officer explains discretion in shoplifting call

BROKEN ARROW — Broken Arrow Police Officer Chad Burden last week shelled out \$17 to a shoplifting suspect whose 3-year-old daughter needed a coat.

He received much more in return.

"You have empathy because you have your own kids, and you can see your kids in that situation," Burden, a father of three, said Tuesday in a telephone interview. "... A \$17 coat is not a life-changing thing for a lot of people, but maybe for a little girl, it is."

Burden responded to a call about a shoplifter Friday afternoon at Wal-Mart, 2301 W. Kenosha St., Police Chief David Boggs said. A woman had been detained by the store's Loss Prevention office, which had caught her trying to steal a coat, Boggs said.

Upon investigation, Burden learned that the woman was a couple of dollars short on the purchase of the garment for her child, the police chief said.

After discussing the incident with Wal-Mart officials, who declined to pursue an arrest, Burden bought the coat for the family, drove the pair home and made follow-up contacts to ensure they had the support of social services, Boggs said.

"The woman's story was heart-wrenching," Boggs said Monday in a phone interview. "She was trying to provide for her kid. She just didn't make the right choice."

Friday's high in Tulsa was 32 degrees, according to the National Weather Service. A friend dropped the mother off Friday at a day care center, and she and her child walked more than a mile to the Wal-Mart store, Boggs said.

The mother was wearing sandals without socks because she didn't have laces for her shoes, said Burden, who also provided her money for those.

"As far as I could tell, she had never done anything like this before," Burden said. "Records check out on her. I just don't think she had enough money to buy a coat."

Burden, 42, has spent 18 years in law enforcement, 15 with the BAPD. He said tickets are written and arrests made in about 95 percent of shoplifting situations.

But he added that police also can use their best judgement.

"Sometimes, discretion is a great thing," Burden said. "It's like the best tool of police work. Sometimes, the public doesn't understand that. Typically, when we use our discretion, it doesn't really work out nice like this ... Commonly, we'll have to take an enforcement action on somebody.

"Typically, a person's behavior or past actions kind of predict how our discretion is going to play out. So if you beat your wife a lot or you speed a lot or if you steal a lot, my discretion is limited. That day I was able to use my discretion for a good thing."

1. Be a resident and a registered voter in Broken Arrow for at least six (6) months prior to the election.
2. File notarized forms including name, residence, mailing address, office sought, date of birth, party affiliation, precinct, county where registered, oath affirming the candidate is qualified for the office being sought, and any additional information the Election Board secretary deems necessary.
3. Signatures must be original.

There is no fee to file for candidacy.

After filing, candidate packets with additional information are available at the City of Broken Arrow City Clerk's office, located at 220 S. First Street.

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
